Policy Statement

Prelicensure and Postlicensure Tracks

Evaluation is a shared responsibility between student and instructor, including self-evaluation, formative, and summative evaluations. Each course syllabus contains the course requirements and the criteria for determining the theory and/or clinical performance grades. Class (theory) grades are earned according to a letter system. Each letter is assigned a grade point value as follows that designates the quality of work done. Final grades are truncated. For example: 79.4 = 79; 79.5 = 79; 79.9 = 79.
